I want to acknowledge the work of our Turner team. Like many of you at home, they have been working long hours to manage their family lives and their work commitments from home. Our teacher's design and planning for engaging and purposeful learning for our students is something to celebrate. In addition, I know teachers have been working closely with families who may need some extra personalisation and are actively problem-solving ways to help. Collectively our team has huge compassion and commitment for our community and I thank them for the way they have been reaching out to you. Should you need anything, we are here to help and we have loved hearing your positive feedback to lift us up too!

We will keep this newsletter short and sweet as I know there are lots of other ways we have been communicating with you at home over this past week.

Some good news moments from our school leadership team at Turner this week:

- ⇒ We are maintaining over 96% attendance each day to engage with online learning.
- ⇒ We had 40 people joining online ukulele collective on Wednesday morning.
- ⇒ Our staff learnt how to use breakaway groups in google meets to expand our skills in supporting online collaboration.
- ⇒ Our 3/4 student's have been amazing problem solvers and self-managers this week! They've worked with their teachers and peers to trouble shoot tech issues and support each other to complete the amazing daily learning slides.
- ⇒ Our preschool students have been trialling SeeSaw as an early childhood platform. Students have been posting and sharing videos and photos and teachers have loved connecting with them!
- ⇒ The 1/2 team have been amazing collaborators. We have worked together to produce Inquiry-based lessons and have used a growth mindset to upskill ourselves in the online space. The teachers have loved connecting with the students online.
- ⇒ Our 5/6 students have been highly engaged and amazing self-managers this week! The level of thinking and learning has been thoroughly impressive – with lots of exciting work happening on our projects!
- ⇒ Our wonderful LSA team have been busy refreshing how to lead small group read alouds online.
- ⇒ The on-site students have been enjoying connecting with each other and engaging in their online learning.

Dear parents/carers

Each year we ask for your support for our school through your voluntary family contribution. This forms an important part of our school budget. Your contributions assist us in ensuring that we can offer the best possible education and resources for all our students at Turner.

Each year the School Board, which includes parent members, works with the school to formulate the year's school budget. The money raised through your voluntary contributions, goes directly into specific curriculum budgets to benefit *all* students from preschool to year 6 (Including art and craft equipment, PE, and sport, math, English, science, new IT resources, special programs, and the library).
