


**Managing hazardous materials in Turner School**



The ACT Government is committed to ensuring all public school buildings are safe and have the infrastructure to support high-quality education.

Most ACT public schools were built at a time when asbestos and lead paint were widely used in the building industry. As [a recently published list of schools shows](#), 76 of our 89 schools have lead paint and/or asbestos. Nearly all asbestos in ACT public schools is non-friable, also known as bonded or sheet asbestos.

Turner School was opened in 1953 and both lead paint and asbestos are present at our school.

We know where these materials exist, or are likely to exist, we monitor the locations regularly and we have a management strategy in place to keep our school community safe. Detailed reports are kept at the front office in a Hazardous Materials Register which you are welcome to view.

If you have any general questions about how we manage hazardous materials drop by the front office, or come along to an information night at Dickson College on Monday 10 May from 6-8pm.

The session will include members of the Education Directorate’s Hazardous Materials Taskforce, and lead paint expert Professor Mark Taylor. He is one of the specialists guiding hazardous materials work in ACT public schools ensuring our management is informed by international best practice.

The ACT Government has committed \$15 million to remove hazardous materials from public schools during the next four years. This is in addition to a school upgrade budget of \$99 million which will also help manage lead paint and asbestos.

## Pre-school's Connection to Place- exploring ants

Our connection to the playground is very strong at preschool, every day we take time to listen, feel and notice.

Our pre-schooler's had been noticing that the ants in our playground were moving nests, they had this enormous trail across the bricks and tanbark. We sat all alongside the trail watching them quietly for a while. T we decided we could record what was happening!

A few children set up an iPad in view of the migrating ants to record. Taking time to listen to the children's conversations gave a magical insight into their thinking, views on their world and interactions with each other without adults. Conversations drew on past experiences with nature – discussing their types of homes, status in the hierarchy ('Come on troops' – Sophie) and they began to hypothesise the how and why of what was happening in the playground.

Back in class we did some further research about what was happening, we investigated the BBC's Wonderful World of Ants and of course turning to our nature master – Sir David Attenborough. Sir David showed us 'The Empire of Ants' guiding us through the mysterious realm of ants, presenting us with queens and workers, scouts and soldiers. Our discoveries led us to connecting with ants' complex social dynamics – the unwritten rules of our societies.

We later dived into the story of Edie Ulrich and her mother Edna Sceghi are two of the last fluent speakers of an endangered Aboriginal language. Tjupan is the language of the Aboriginal people to the south of Wiluna in the northern WA Goldfields, now spoken by people around Laverton, Leonora and Kalgoorlie. They showed us how their family hunts for The Honey Ants, their connection to country and how to listen to it.

Our ant watching led to many activities to show our new knowledge, using our fingerprints as ants to show the working class and bold markers highlighting the significance of the queen herself. We explored diagrams, labels and other ways scientist record their data on nature events. After many discussions we decided that the ants had been moving their nest, moving across our playground into the vegetable patch where we had recently added new rich soil. We hypothesised that the ants use the 'new soil to make their homes because there is a lot of vegetables growing for them to all eat' – Molly.

'They may have done it to be closer to the preschool inside where it's warm' – Evan

'The queen tells everyone where to go all the time' – Astri

'The ants like to eat things like slugs and snails. They can eat those things because there are lots of ants and they work in a teamwork' – Philip

'They start moving quickly before it rains. They know when so they start marching'

## Year 5/6 Camp Cooba 2021

This year for 5/6 camp we went to fantastic Camp Cooba; the camp is a renovated motel, made to be a lot of fun! It is located about 30 minutes from Cooma. The buses departed from school at around 8:45am and we got to Cooba at around 10:30am. Camp Cooba is a beautiful place, full of wildlife, and with amazing opportunities for the students to build their learner assets!

Cooba has a wide range of fun activities to participate in, including:

- The Big Swing: a team activity where you get harnessed up and pulled to the top of a 12 metre high structure and when you pull the red ball you drop and swing- it is scary but lots of fun! When you get to the top, you can see the whole of the beautiful grounds.
- Low Ropes: a teamwork obstacle course with tyres and lots of rope that you have to climb through or over using communication with your team.
- The Assault Course: a series of obstacles with jumping, climbing, balancing, crawling, pulling and running. The last obstacle is where you have to swim through mud and crawl through a mud tunnel!
- Survivor: an obstacle course, including hills and mud that you have to push a buggy (with no engine) around and through using collaboration within your team.
- Team Maneuvers: an orienteering challenge with 3-4 teams and 2 captains. You get walkie talkies and a map, having to find clues across the gorgeous campgrounds. This one definitely built our communication skills!
- Leap of Faith: A jump that takes a whole lot of confidence. You are harnessed up, then you climb up a pole via a ladder and then jump off a little platform onto a metal trapeze bar.
- Archery: where you have a bow and an arrow and have to shoot at the target - the closer you get to the bullseye decides how many points you get.

At Cooba the food was awesome! There was a very big variety of food over the three days including: lasagne, chocolate mousse, pizza, local fruit, cookies, hash browns, toast... well all this as well as much more fabulous foods! In our free time we were allowed to go to the games room, feed their horses (named Westen and Wallock), choose a quiet activity or borrow their sports equipment.

Camp was awesome and we all came back very tired! It was a great opportunity to build our learner assets, SCARFF values and to have fun with each other! The Cooba teachers said that we were one of the best groups to visit and our teachers agreed!
