- **1.1** The meeting was opened by the Chair at 7.00 pm and they thanked everyone for attending.

### 2. Business

### 2.1 Previous Meeting Minutes (July 2021)

It was Moved by the President and seconded by the Public Officer that the minutes of July 2021 be approved. **CARRIED** 

### 2.2 Action arising

- the sumarised reports for 2019-20 have been submitted to ACNC, this is now complete,
- the Winter disco has been canceled due to lock down,
- the survey on behalf of the Board and the P&C is underway. There was a discussion that it would be helpful to understand the feedback that comes from other schools as well, noting that this has previously been passed onto the ACT Education Directorate,

- The Vice President gave an update on the pizza oven and gave an overview of relative costs. Approximately \$3,000 to \$5,000 for a smaller oven that would self-assemble. 40% additional costs to have it assembled should a parent not be able to assist. Price and logistics for how we move the oven would need to be determined. The Principal emphasised portability would be required to ensure safety on school grounds out of hours (outside staff room or on the other side of the living skills garden were storage options). There was a discussion about the location of the pizza oven at North Ainslie school. It was suggested that the proposal is affordable. The school could consider a potential permanent location, and or liability and safety concerns in due course.

# 2.3 Fundraising and parent engagement for 2021, including engagement survey The Principal reported that the colour run would fit into (term 4 – week 11) with the event to run similar to cross country (ie by the school) with P&C able to coordinate fundraising activities associated. The event would be in school time, at the end of a day, a team of teachers would assist and organise (with sports captains, also with the year sixes for whom it would be a leadership opportunity).

It was agreed in discussion that the mini fete be postponed.

### 2.5 President's Report

### 2.6 Treasurer's Report

The Treasurer's report had been provided prior to the meeting. It was noted that the payment for the \$2,500 donation has been made to school for the artist and writers festival, and the receipt is awaited. The insurance has been paid, and the balance of the account is approximately \$32,638.64 with no outstanding liabilities.

### 2.7 Principal's Report

The Principal's report had been provided prior to the meeting. Lots of work is underway preparing for online learning from Friday, with plans in place for both a shorter and extended lockdown. Logistics are being explored with regards to device and learning from home packs. The school is working with ACT health. Health and well-being of students is also a focus, and Alison outlined some supports in place. P&C acknowledged the work of the school and the Executive team and thanks to Aarthi also for the communications via the Facebook page. The Principal also highlighted the success of the festival, with a huge number of parents able to join activities in a COVID-19 safe way, which was fantastic.

### 2.8 Board Report

Aarthi thanked all staff at the school for the smooth transition to online learning, noting good feedback about the regularity of communication, and the quick provision of Chromebooks. The general feeling is we have done this before and it is not as uncertain as in 2020.

The last Board meeting was 28 July, focus was next school improvement plan. Thanks to those who completed the vision and values survey. The school improvement plan will continue to be developed over the next few meetings.

### 2.9 Public Officer Report

Annie provided a verbal update, highlighting the improved website and google drive will assist going forward.

# Move to online learning:

 We move to a period of teacher-led remote learning from Friday 20 August where students are encouraged to stay at home while the ACT enters a more prolonged lock down as part of our health response to COVID-19.

- Turner will remain open for vulnerable young people who cannot work from home. Those students will access the same remote learning program as their classmates, delivered by their usual classroom teacher/s.
- Each year group will have its own tailored approach, you can expect regular check-ins and engagement with your child. This will include physical and digital resources for our younger including library books, and online connections through a virtual classroom.
- The learning platform for years 1-6 will be the familiar google classroom. For the Preschool and Kindergarten remote learning period we will be trialling the SeeSaw platform which is expected to be more early childhood friendly in it's format.
- Information about home learning resources, processes and devices will be going out to all families tomorrow.


### **School Improvement Special Highlights:**
